#### **04** Review Access and Permissions

- ✓ Audit who has access to shared folders, systems, and cloud apps
- ✓ Remove access for ex-employees or third-party vendors no longer under contract
- ✓ Check admin roles—reduce these to the bare minimum
- ✓ Turn on MFA where it isn't already active

- ✓ Note removed apps and retired devices
- ✓ Log software versions and patch history
- Record access and permission changes
